# Why Get Certain Types of Insurance Coverage?

#### **Insurance for Individuals:**

- <u>Full Coverage Auto:</u> Your vehicle was stolen at a concert and recovered severely damaged. Luckily you had full coverage—which includes not only liability coverage and collision coverage, but also **comprehensive coverage**—so you had a covered claim.
- Personal Umbrella Insurance: You were deemed at-fault for a big multi-car accident with high property damage and injury costs, maxing out your auto insurance liability limits. Your umbrella helped pay for exceeding damages so you didn't have to pay out-of-pocket.

"More recently, the social distancing and self-isolating recommended to combat the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic has been dangerous for those in recovery. In Snohomish County, opioid-related deaths rose 53% from the first quarter to the second quarter of 2020 – just as the stay-at-home orders were taking effect. Fentanyl-related deaths are up 162% for the same period. In addition, there is plenty of anecdotal evidence of an increase in relapse and struggles with mental health. The Cafe's work is to create a safe space for people to heal and transform their lives. The work is intentional, to meet people where they are at and support with honesty and encouragement the forward movement in their lives."

- Other summer items that get sold out fast at the store: sunscreen, beach towels, beach toys, pools, hoses, sprinklers, water balloons, BBQ cooking supplies and meat, water filters, and ice.
- Do maintenance: check car fluids, check tire pressure, consider an oil change, restock your roadside kit, and do a sweep of your property to see if anything needs addressed.
- Avoid summer fires by taking precautions such as: having campfires 25+ feet away from tents, watering your garden regularly, not using a BBQ on an enclosed deck or indoors, not leaving a fire/BBQ/hot stove/candle/tiki torch unattended, not overpowering extension cords or circuits, and following the other preventative measures listed on page 1.
